Q&A with Penny Saunders

It is no easy task to start and sustain a dance company, and Noe & James are perfectly suited for it. They gathered an all-star team, and it was an absolute honor to be a part of it.

What projects have you been working on since the SDC performances last July?

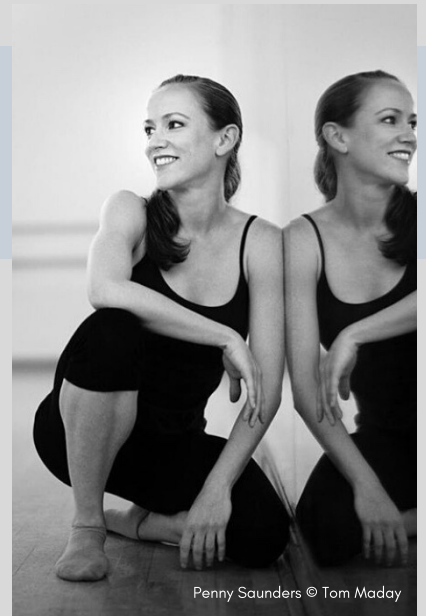
Since last summer with SDC, I have made new works for The Grand Rapids Ballet and Tulsa Ballet, as well as remounted older pieces on The Royal New Zealand Ballet, Dayton Ballet, Ballet Idaho, Diablo Ballet, and Indiana University. After a quiet holiday season at home with my family, I will be creating new works with Oklahoma City Ballet and BalletX. Then, I will be returning to Seattle for the premiere of my third work for Whim W'Him at the end of May. I just can't seem to stay away!!

What types of ideas are you exploring and what can audiences expect to see in your upcoming works?

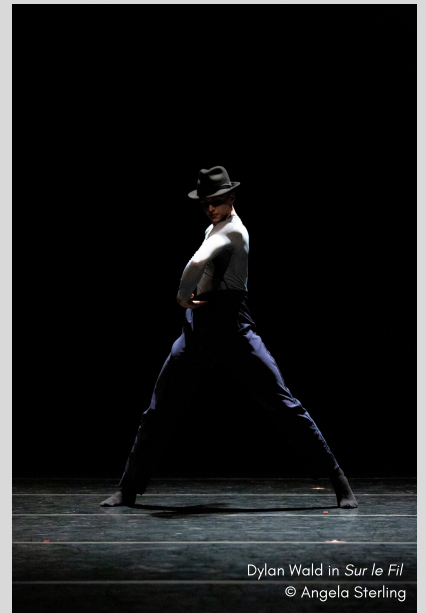
The ideas that I am exploring for upcoming works are pretty spread out—ranging from a story-like ballet about Emily Dickinson, to a more abstract narrative about the divisive nature of the media today. I think that the common thread is that they both have some relevance to current events. I am usually drawn to themes that help me better understand the state of the world today.

What excites you about a new process?

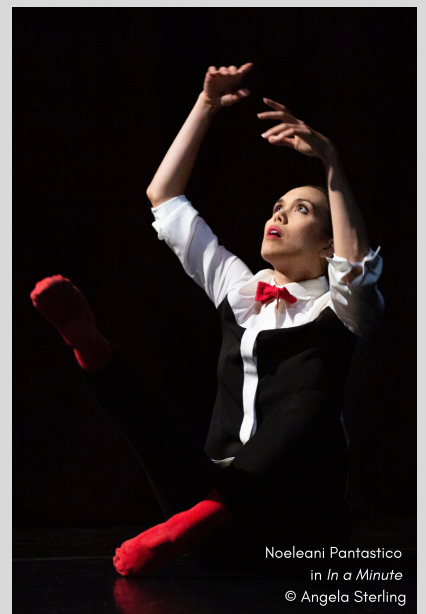
